Upon entering Boslowen you will find some storage for boots, beach balls, buckets and Birkenstocks. Also on the ground floor is the first bedroom, with a 3/4 size double bed, original sash window and plenty of clothing storage. Up the first set of stairs to the first floor homes the spacious master bedroom. The master bedroom is a bright oasis with a comfortable kingsize bed, TV, wardrobe and drawer space and En-suite shower room with separate toilet.

Along the hall is the third bedroom which includes 2 single bunk beds, lots more clothing storage, continuing the calming seaside aesthetic of the cottage. The contemporary family bathroom is at the end of the hallway, boasting a bathtub for those relaxing summer evening soaks, shower head over the bath, toilet and sink with ring light mirror above.

The large open plan living space spans the second floor featuring wooden floors, vaulted ceilings, decorative log burner and bay window seating overlooking the historic cobbled streets below. The space flows superfluously from the kitchen that has solid granite worktops, 5-ring gas hob and double electric oven, integrated Fridge-Freezer, dishwasher and washing machine, to the dining area with bench style seating, into the living area with deep comfortable sofas, 40" Freeview TV and large bean bag. The space is flooded with natural light and the bean bag area could even double as a small stage for family charades.

An architectural spiral staircase guides you to the final mezzanine floor, home to the second living space. Nestled in the dormer window of the roof space, with incredible sea views, this cosy chill zone has an occasional day bed, wooden floors and is perfect for admiring the view with a glass of wine of an evening. Directly underneath Boslowen is its own private parking space to the left hand side of the car port for your convenience.





Explore St Ives

There aren't many British seaside towns that manage to be both quaint and cool at the same time but St Ives ticks all the boxes. As well as its famous white sandy beaches, turquoise sea and golden light, this artists' mecca also has a thriving food scene, great surf and miles of breathtaking nearby coastline to explore.

Art

Tate is a national institution which is a network of four galleries that is home to the United Kingdom's collection of British art and international contemporary art. Set directly above the beautiful Porthmeor beach, Tate is the perfect place to lose yourself amongst the array of creative inspirations, browse the shop for a keepsake piece to take home with you and enjoy a bite to eat in the café.

The Barbara Hepworth museum and gardens nestled within the cobbled streets of St Ives displays the artist's iconic modern sculptures and other artworks along with a brief history of her creative journey and life from when she resided in the town during the Second World War.

Harbour Galleries along The Wharf is an arcade of 7 shops that offer a range of affordable prints, original works, sculptures, glassware and other coastal inspired artworks by local artists.

Food

St Ives has a rich history of iconic food and drink and the town is home to some award winning restaurants. From classic fish & chip shops sourcing locally sourced seafood to ice-cream parlours using Cornish reared dairy products, to deli's, bakeries, tea rooms, vegetarian restaurants and michelin star establishments.

At the top end of fine dining experiences has to be The Ugly Butterfly in The Carbis Bay Hotel. Ugly Butterfly showcases Chef Adam Handling's passion for converting locally sourced, quality ingredients into beautifully presented dishes, packed full of flavour. In keeping with both Adam's and the Estate's ethos, there is a strong focus on sustainability. Ugly Butterfly offers an all-day, fine-dining experience. Chef, Adam, has created the menus in the restaurant to be as elevated and theatrical as at 'Frog by Adam Handling' in London's Covent Garden and uses ingredients carefully sourced from in and around Cornwall.

The Allotment Deli stock a wide range of Cornish produce including award winning salamis, cheeses, olives and Cornish pies. They offer plenty of vegan treats to choose from, plus a range of speciality gluten free foods.

Beaches

Most people visit St Ives for its world famous beaches with their beautiful golden sand and striking turquoise waters, making you feel as if you're on a tropical island in paradise. The 6 main beaches of St Ives are : Porthgwidden, Porthmeor, Harbour Beach, Carbis Bay Beach, Porthkidney and Porthminster.
